Enrol to Vote

Follow these 3 easy steps to ensure you can vote at this year's election.

Recent federal government changes may stop you voting for your rights at work!

How can you make sure your vote counts?

Step 1: Check your enrolment details

Ensure you are correctly enrolled to vote, go to the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) enrolment website <https://oevf.aec.gov.au/> and confirm your enrolment.

If your enrolment is not confirmed go to Step 2.

Step 2: Fill out the application form

You need to fill out the correct state based application form. You can get one from the Post Office, the AEC or download one from the AEC website at www.aec.gov.au You also need to satisfy one of the following proof of identity tests:

- Provide your driver's licence number in Section A on Page 3.
- **Or if you don't have a licence, you can:**
- Show one original piece of ID (such as your Medicare card, Birth Certificate or passport) to an authorised person (as listed on the form) who is on the electoral role and they will then sign the declaration on your enrolment form in Section B on Page 3, **or**
- Ask two people who are already on the electoral role who have known you for at least a month to confirm your identity by signing your enrolment form in Section C on Page 3. Your Delegate can help you with this.

Step 3: Hand it back

Post the completed form back to the Australian Electoral Commission, Reply paid 9867, in your capital city.
