Something Stinks at Chevron



At Barrow Island, off the Pilbara Coast in Western Australia, the temperature in Summer can get up to 45⁰.

Yet today, 1500 Construction and Maritime Workers are living on a Floatel (Floating Hotel), off Chevron's Gorgon LNG Project at Barrow Island, that is hot and noisy, has no air conditioning and smells like sewerage and pesticides. Workers are going to work tired because they are not getting enough rest with some sleeping on wet towels just to try and stay cool.

Despite hundreds of complaints from workers and a duty of care Chevron hasn't done anything about it.

Since Chevron's Gorgon LNG Project started up they've been telling us all that the project is being well managed despite the project being at least 18 months late and more than \$17 billion over budget.

Last month Chevron's CEO even told investors that they've been managing things on the island "fairly well and we're planning for a flawless start-up commissioning and start-up process".

If Chevron was really managing things "fairly well" in Australia the health and safety of workers would matter and they would have improved conditions on the Floatel.
